

2. The final sound is pronounced /t/ after the voiceless sounds
/f/, /k/, /p/, /s/, /ch/, /sh/, /c/, /x/

3. The final sound is pronounced /d/ after the voiced sounds,
/v/, /n/, /r/, /g/, /l/, /s/, /z/, /b/, /m/

hugged
judged
pulled

4. The final sound is pronounced /d/ after vowel sounds.

played
skied

tied
snowed

5. The final sound is pronounced /id/ after /t/ and /d/. /id/ adds a syllable.

want - wanted
instruct - instructed
rest - rested
attend - attended
