B) Present Continuous in the future

Subject + verb to be (am / is / are) + verb -ing

- ❑ **Use: Present Continuous in the future:**
- ❑ To talk about a planned event in an exact place and time in the future.
 - ❑ Hayrettin **is visiting** his aunt this afternoon.
 - ❑ Fatma **is having** her hair dyed next weekend.
 - ❑ They're **having** a listening quiz next Tuesday.
 - ❑ I'm **seeing** my dentist this Saturday.
