Modal Verbs: Must / Have To

- We use **must** to say that something is **necessary** or very important to do.
- We use **must not** to say that something is **not allowed**.

- We also use **have to** to say that something is **necessary**.
- We use **don't have to** to say that something is **not necessary**.
