



## USING WHILE WITH THE PAST PROGRESSIVE

(a) The phone rang **while I was sleeping**. OR:  
(b) **While I was sleeping**, the phone rang.

**while + subject + verb = a time clause**  
*While I was sleeping* is a time clause.  
A **while-clause** describes an activity that was in progress at the time another activity happened.  
The verb in a **while-clause** is often past progressive (e.g., *was sleeping*).
