

What's a Sentence?

A sentence is a group of words that tell one complete idea.

What's a Run-on Sentence?

A run-on sentence is a group of words that smashes 2 sentences together.

Nothing connects the 2 sentences.

Here are 2 ways to **fix** 2 sentences that have been smashed together:

- 1) **Connect** the 2 sentences with connector words like "and" or "but."
He likes cats he doesn't like dogs. ==> He likes cats, **but** he doesn't like dogs.
- 2) **Separate** the sentences. Put a **period** at the end of the first sentence.
Start the second sentence with a capital (big) letter.
He likes cats he doesn't like dogs. ==> He likes cats. **H**e doesn't like dogs.


