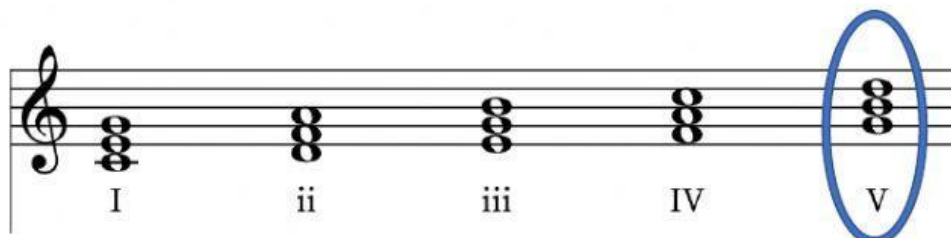


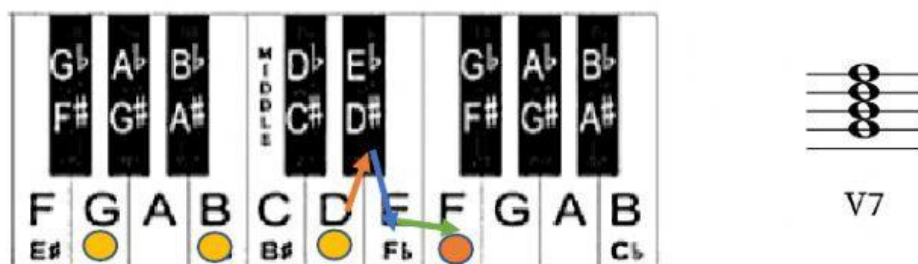
Dominant 7th

To build a Dominant 7th, you must first work out chord V in your chosen key.

e.g. in the key of C Major, chord V is G major:



To turn G major into a dominant 7th (V7), count 3 semitones up from the 5th. Add that to the chord, and you have a Dominant 7th!

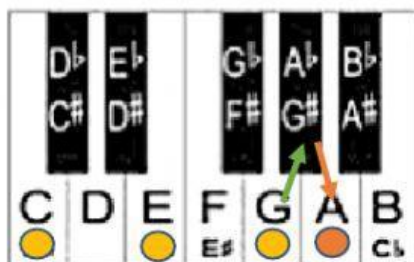
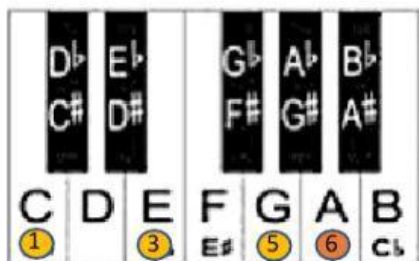


Added 6th

To create an added 6th, simply add the 6th interval to any major chord.

For example, in a C major chord, the 6th interval would be A:

You can also work it out by counting a tone up from the 5th:
