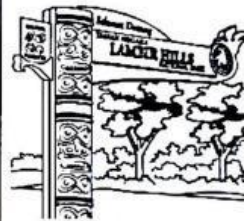

### Gua Tempurung

Gua Tempurung, located in Malaysia, is a renowned limestone cave system that (0) offered a captivating experience to visitors from around the world. ### The Traditional Malaysian House

The traditional Malaysian house, also known as a "kampung house" or "rumah kampung," embodies the rich cultural heritage of Malaysia and reflects the lifestyle of its people. The design of the traditional Malaysian house give priority to harmony with nature and takes into account the hot and humid climate of the region. The houses are often constructed on stilts, which serve several purposes. In addition to providing ventilation, elevating the house above the ground helps to cool the house and protect it from flooding during heavy rains. Furthermore, stilt houses also minimize the impact of insects and wild animals that could enter the living spaces.

Traditional Malaysian houses are primarily constructed using natural materials found locally. Additionally, the main components of these houses are usually timber and bamboo, which are abundant in the region. The timber frames provide a sturdy structure, while bamboo is used for walls, flooring, and sometimes roofing. On the other hand, Nipah palm leaves and thatched grass are commonly used for the roof covering, providing insulation and protection from rain.

Moving on to the layout of the traditional Malaysian house, it is typically simple and functional. It often consists of a single large room for the living and sleeping area, with a raised platform at one end for dining and socializing. The kitchen and bathroom are usually located separately from the main living space, connected by a covered walkway. This separation is due to cultural and hygienic considerations.

The traditional Malaysian house is rich in symbolism and reflects cultural beliefs of the people. For example, the roofs of some houses are designed with curved, sweeping lines, resembling the wings of a bird, as a symbol of protection and freedom.

Malaysia's badminton partnership of Thinaah Muralitharan and Pearly Tan gained significant attention after securing their first World Tour title in Switzerland early 2021. **Traditional Musical Instruments**

Malaysia, a diverse country in Southeast Asia, is home to a rich cultural heritage that includes a vibrant music scene. (35) ☐ These musical instruments have been passed down through generations. The *gamelan* is a traditional Malaysian ensemble consisting of a combination of percussion instruments, including gongs, drums, metallophones, xylophones, and bamboo flutes. The ensemble is usually played together in intricate rhythmic patterns, creating a mesmerizing and harmonious sound. (36) ☐

The *seruling* is a bamboo flute that is commonly found in traditional Malaysian music. (37) ☐ It is often used to accompany traditional dances, storytelling sessions, and folk songs.

Another musical instrument is the *rebana*. The *rebana* is a large frame drum that is widely used in Malay traditional music. It is made of a wooden frame. (38) ☐ It is played with the hands and produces deep, resonant sounds. The *rebana* is commonly used in cultural processions and festive celebrations.

Although originating from Indonesia, the *angklung* has become popular in Malaysia as well. It is a musical instrument made of bamboo tubes attached to a bamboo frame. (39) ☐ The *angklung* is often used in schools and community settings to teach children about music and rhythm.

Then, there is the *kompang* which is a small hand drum traditionally used in Malay cultural events and Islamic ceremonies. It consists of a wooden frame with a goat or cowhide stretched over one side.
