Do you ever think about how much your smart phone can do for you? You can do lots of things like make calls, play games, surf the Internet and take photos. Now, that same technology can be used to track wild animals. In the past, we weren't able to track an animal's every move, so we couldn't easily gather information such as when it hunted, what it hunted and how big an area it could cover. But now, when a wild animal is fitted with a 'smart collar' scientists can track every move. We can learn about their behavior, and understand when and where animals hunt. We can then use this information to reduce human-wildlife conflict.
