HOSPITAL ADMISSIONS

Activity 1: Read the following steps for a hospital admission. Order the sequence correctly.

1. **Admission to the Ward:** The patient is escorted to the designated ward, where a nurse provides further orientation and starts the care plan.
2. **Assigning a Bed and Room:** The patient is assigned to a room in the appropriate department (e.g., cardiology, internal medicine) and given a bed.
3. **Decision for Admission:** Based on the evaluation, the doctor decides if the patient needs to be admitted for treatment. If yes, the patient is assigned to a specific ward.
4. **Documentation and Consent:** The patient signs consent forms for treatment and any necessary procedures. All medical records are documented in the patient's file.
5. **Initial Treatment Plan:** The doctor outlines a treatment plan, prescribes medications, and informs the patient about the expected duration of stay and further procedures.
6. **Medical Evaluation:** The doctor conducts a detailed assessment, including medical history, physical examination, and necessary diagnostic tests (e.g., blood tests, X-rays).
7. **Ongoing Monitoring and Treatment:** The patient's condition is regularly monitored by the healthcare team, and the treatment is adjusted as needed.
8. **Patient Arrival:** The patient arrives at the hospital, either through the emergency department or by a scheduled appointment.
9. **Registration:** The patient's personal information (name, age, address, contact details) and reason for admission are collected. This step also includes obtaining identification and insurance details.
10. **Triage and Initial Assessment:** A nurse or medical staff evaluates the patient's condition to prioritize care based on severity.
