POSITIVE SENTENCES

LANGUAGE USAGE

Contrasting more than two nouns, follow the format noun + verb + the most + quality + object in adjectives with three or more syllables.

EXAMPLE

This concert hall is the most beautiful in the city.

NEGATIVE SENTENCES

This is not the most comfortable room I've ever been in.

SUPERLATIVES

Adjectives with one syllable, add: 'the' + '-est' (or '-st')	cold "January is often <u>the</u> <u>coldest</u> winter month."
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Adjectives with two or more syllables, add: 'the' + 'most'	ex-pen-sive "This book is <u>the</u> <u>most</u> expensive book in the store."
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Irregular Superlative Adjectives

good – the best

bad – the worst

far – the farthest
the furthest

<p>Adjectives with two syllables that end in '-y', change '-y' to 'i' and add: 'the' + '-est' (or '-st')</p>	<p>hap-py</p> <p>"John is <u>the</u> <u>happiest</u> person I know."</p>
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Adjectives that end in a single vowel and consonant: double the final letter before adding 'the' + '-est' (or '-st')	big "Brazil is <u>the</u> biggest country in South America."




