The Paralympics is the largest sporting event for disabled athletes in the world. Athletes from six disability groups take part during the eleven days of competition. However, both the organizers and the athletes stress that the sporting performance is more important than the participant's disabilities. Paralympics is to show people's athletic abilities, not their disability. Paralympians strive for equality to those who compete in the Olympics.

The Paralympics have come a long way since 1984, when a sports competition was first held in England for World War II veterans with spinal injuries. Sir Ludwig Guttmann was the man who began the Paralympic Games. He first organized the International wheelchair games. Soon after this he attempted to involve the wheelchair games to the Olympics. The first official Paralympic Games were held in Rome in 1960. 400 athletes from 23 countries competed in

this event. At first it was only people with wheelchair disabilities competing but then people with other disabilities started to join.

The Paralympics include both Summer and Winter Games and now take place alongside the Olympics at the same venue in the same year. Events such as wheelchair rugby are very popular with spectators and require great skill. Another favourite is three-track skiing. Here disabled competitors ski on one leg while supporting themselves on two crutches which also have small skis attached to them. In recent years the Paralympics have grown dramatically, both in popularity and in the number of athletes taking part. This growth will continue in the future as more and more countries send representatives to the Games.
