

Used to express what another person said.

Direct speech are the actual words. **Reported speech** is what a third person says

→ 'I'm leaving'

→ He said he was leaving

We will divide them into 4 groups:

1. Statements
2. Yes/No questions
3. WH-questions
4. Imperative
5. Other cases

1. Statements

What did he say?

'I'm sorry for everything I have done'

1. 'I'm never wrong'

2. 'I will build a wall next year'

6. 'I can't remember the last time I apologized'

5. 'I have one of the greatest memories of all times'

a. Agree/Promise/Offer + infinitive

She **offered** to

She **agreed**

b. Suggest / Recommend

She **suggested** going

She **suggested** that we **should** finish

She **suggested** that we **stop** (infinitive without to)

He **recommended** leaving soon

He **recommended** that she **should** leave

He **recommended** that she study more

' My husband is here ', she said	She said husband was
' My friend loves this ', he said	He said friend loved
' We'll take these mobiles', they said	They said would take mobiles
' We've just arrived now ', they said	They said had just arrived
	He said to me had got lost
'I got lost yesterday ', he told me /
	He said grandma (had) fallen.....
' My grandma fell last week ', he said /
	He said was leaving
'I'm leaving tomorrow ', he announced /
	They said were going to travel to Istanbul
' We are going to travel to Istanbul next week ', they said /
