- Adverbs of time usually go *in the middle* / *at the end* of sentences.
 - Adverbs of degree are usually placed *before* / *after* the adjective, adverb, or verb they modify.
 - Adverbs of manner are usually placed *before* / *after* the main verb or object in a sentence.
 - Adverbs of place usually come *before* / *after* the main verb or at the end of the clause they modify.
 - Adverbs of frequency usually come *before* / *after* the main verb but after auxiliary verbs.
- If the main verb is the verb *to be*, the adverb is placed *before* / *after*.
