The character of the Belgian detective Hercule Poirot <sup>1</sup>was created by the writer Agatha Christie in the 1920s. Between 1920 and 1975 over 800 Poirot novels and short stories <sup>2</sup>\_\_\_\_\_. In the stories, Poirot sometimes works alone, but usually he <sup>3</sup>\_\_\_\_\_ by his assistant, Captain Hastings. Poirot always dresses smartly and he <sup>4</sup>\_\_\_\_\_ for his neat moustache and his polite manners.
