LEARNING TO LEARN: LISTENING

Understanding why listening is challenging

Many language learners consider listening the most challenging skill to master. The first step in improving your listening is to understand the reason why it's challenging. Sometimes, you might struggle with the pace or the speaker's accent; other times you might have difficulty with the grammar or vocabulary they use. When you're having difficulty understanding a listening exercise, look at the audioscript and ask yourself: Can I understand the listening exercise when I read the script?

If the answer is "yes," then you need more listening practice. The speaker is probably speaking quickly or in an unfamiliar accent. The more practice you get with different speakers and accents, the more you'll understand what you hear. Try listening again to parts that you find difficult, and follow along on the audioscript. Then listen again without reading.

If the answer is "no," then the challenge is in the grammar and vocabulary. As you learn more grammar and vocabulary, you'll be able to understand more of what you hear. Try writing down language you don't understand as you listen. Then look up unfamiliar words and try to figure out what's going on grammatically.

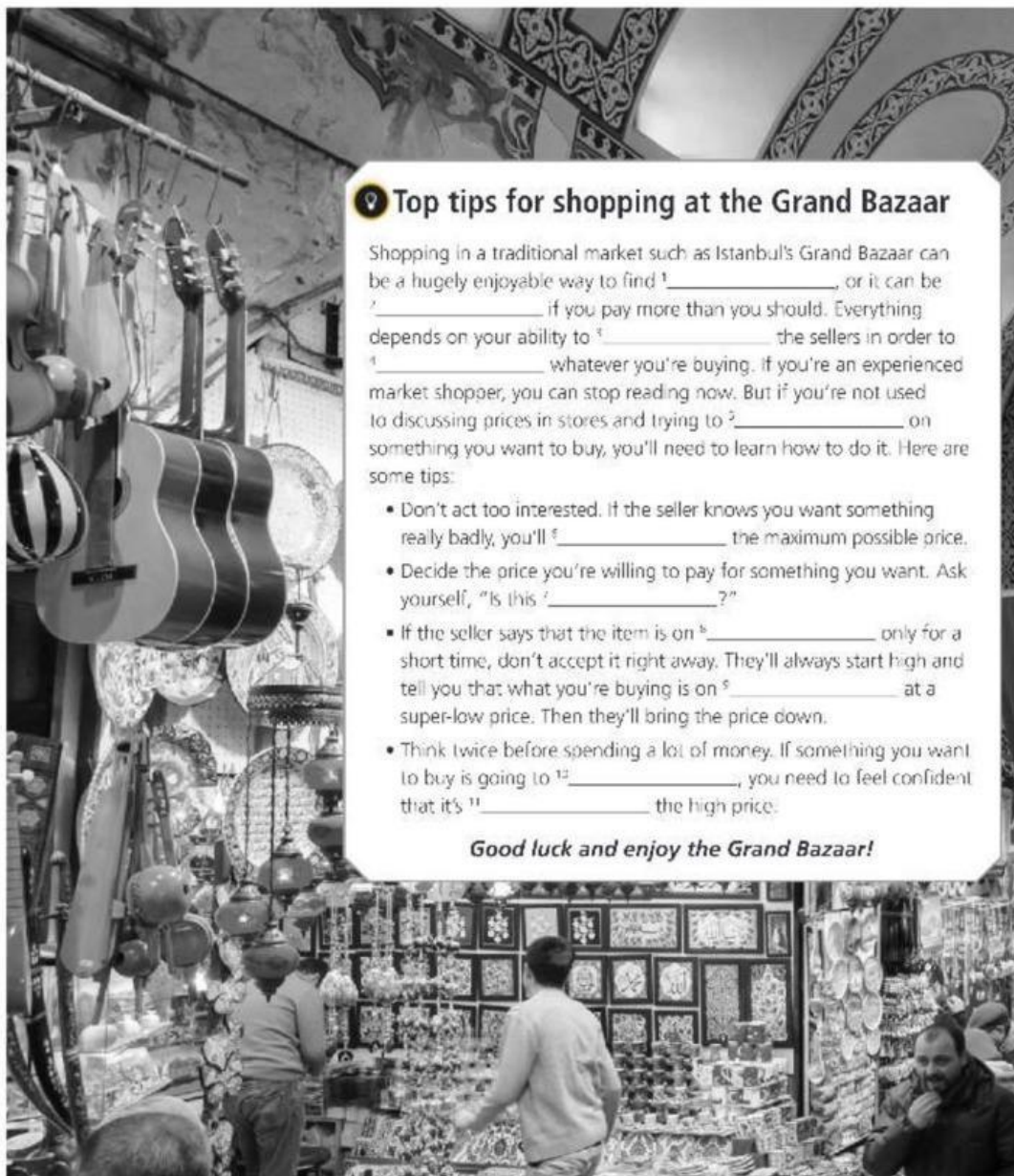
