

18 CONDITIONAL CLAUSE (TYPE 2)

DRUGIEGO TRYBU WARUNKOWEGO używamy, aby opisać:

- mało prawdopodobne lub wręcz niemożliwe sytuacje w teraźniejszości lub przyszłości, np. *If I were taller, I would play basketball better.*
 - swoją opinię lub radę odnośnie do konkretnej sytuacji, np. *If I were you, I wouldn't buy such an old car.*
- Zdania w drugim trybie warunkowym tworzymy używając następujących form czasownika:
- w zdaniu podrzędnym (ze spójnikiem *if*) używamy czasu *Past Simple*, np.: *If they had children...* lub *If he didn't speak so fast...*

Uwaga: korzystając z czasownika *to be*, możemy we wszystkich osobach zastosować formę *were*; w przypadku 1. i 3. osoby liczby pojedynczej (*I, he, she, it*) – obie formy (**was** i **were**) są poprawne, np. *If I were rich ...* lub *If I was rich ...*; *If the weather were better ...* lub *If the weather was better ...*.

- w zdaniu nadrzędnym używamy czasownika **would** z bezokolicznikiem, np. *It would be better if ..., They wouldn't have so much trouble if ...*
