



Past simple: regular and irregular (PB p37)

REMEMBER

For regular verbs, we add -ed to make the past simple.
Some verbs are irregular, e.g. *write-wrote*.
In past simple negative sentences and questions, we use the past of *do*.



I / You / He / She / We / They	watched an advert.
	made a video call.
	didn't watch an advert.
	didn't make a video call.

Did	I / you / he / she / we / they	watch an advert?
		make a video call?

Yes,	I / you / he / she / we / they	did.
No,	I / you / he / she / we / they	didn't.
