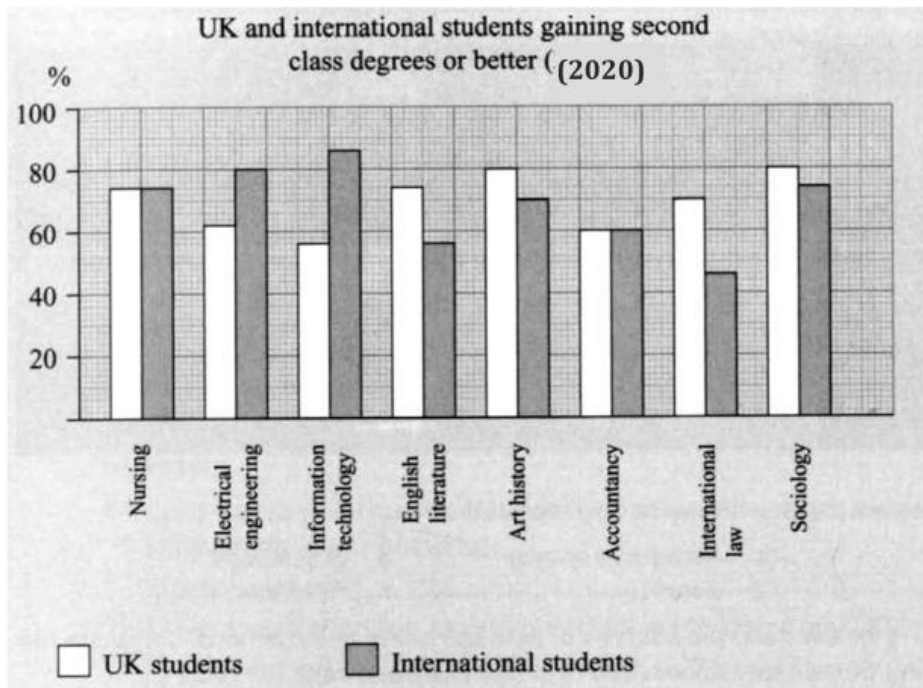




Rearrange the following sentences to make a complete answer to the Practice Test above.

There are four paragraphs in total.

In Electrical Engineering and Information Technology, four out of five degrees awarded to students from abroad were second class or better (versus fewer than two out of three for home students).

For the UK students, over half of the degrees awarded were second class or better.

The lowest was in Information Technology (55 per cent).

The bar chart shows the percentage of home and international students in the UK achieving at least a second class degree in eight subjects in 2020.

The largest percentage of good passes was in Art History and Sociology (80 per cent).

However, the percentage gaining good degrees in subjects such as English Literature (55 per cent) and Law (50 per cent) was lower than—the corresponding rate for home students (roughly 70 per cent).

In brief, the chart shows that home students tended to do better in Arts and Social Science-related subjects, whereas international students tended to do better in technology related subjects.

For international students, the rates were similarly high, though figures for individual subjects differed.
