The doctor **told me not to** smoke .

**"Get out of the car!"** said the policeman.

The policeman **ordered him to** get out of the car.

**"Don't get out of the car!"** said the policeman.

The policeman **ordered him not to** get out of the car.

**"Please** be quiet," she said.

She **asked me to be** quiet.

**"Could you** be quiet," she said.

She **asked me to be** quiet.

The man with the gun said to us, **"Don't move!"**

The man with the gun **warned us not to** move.
