EXAM TIP

WHEN YOU CHANGE INDIRECT SPEECH INTO DIRECT SPEECH, THINK CAREFULLY ABOUT THE PRONOUNS (I, HE, SHE, ETC.) AND THE TENSES.

REMEMBER

IN DIRECT SPEECH, 3RD PERSON PRONOUNS (HE, SHE, IT) COME 1ST PERSON PRONOUNS (E.G. I, YOU).

REMEMBER

WITH QUESTIONS BEGINNING WITH THE WORDS WHERE, WHO, WHAT, WHEN, WHY, HOW, WHICH WE USE THOSE WORDS IN THE DIRECT AND THE INDIRECT SPEECH.
'WHERE'S THE LIBRARY?' HE ASKED WHERE THE LIBRARY WAS.
IN YES/NO QUESTIONS WE USE THE WORD IF IN THE INDIRECT SPEECH. 'HAVE YOU GOT ANY MONEY?' HE ASKED ME IF I'D GOT ANY MONEY.
