

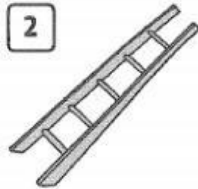

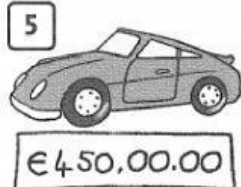

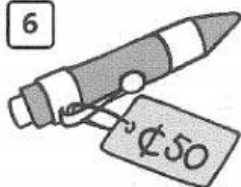

Comparatives and superlatives: long adjectives



My bed is **more** comfortable **than** this one.
It's **less** expensive **than** a new bed.



This is **the most** expensive bed in the shop.
This is **the least** expensive one.

Adjectives with 2+ syllables = **more / less than** and **the most / the least**.
But 2-syllable adjectives ending in -y = **-ier** and **the -iest**. (e.g. *happier, happiest*).

Irregular comparatives and superlatives

This bed is **good**.
This one is **better**.
And this one is **the best**!

This bed is **bad**.
This one is **worse**.
And this one is **the worst**.



My old bed is the best of all!

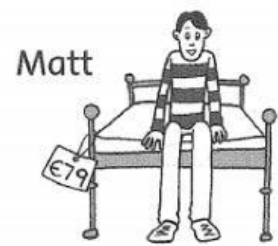
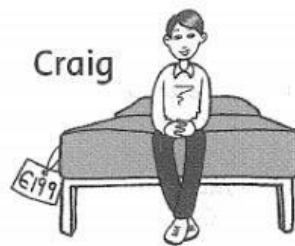
