Universal Basic Income (or UBI) has been attracting a lot of attention lately. This idea means giving every adult the same amount of money on a regular basis, which they can spend in any way they like. UBI would be different from other social benefits because people wouldn't have to meet any requirements to receive it. As a result, it would be paid to someone getting a high salary as well as a¹ _____ (JOB) person without any earnings. At first glance, giving away money 'for free' or treating the rich and the poor in the same way may seem unfair, but UBI is supposed to solve the growing problem of job insecurity.
