

- Addis Ababa means "new flower" in Amharic.
- 15 • Ethiopians have a different way of keeping time. They believe that the clock should start when the sun goes up. So every morning at first light, the time in Ethiopia is 00:00.
- Ethiopia has won more gold medals than any other country in Olympic marathons.
- 20 • Ethiopians discovered coffee. Many traditional Ethiopians even have a daily ceremony² of preparing and serving coffee that can take up to three hours. The youngest woman of the house wears a long white dress and pours coffee three times for the family members and their guests. The idea of the ceremony is to bring people together and to help them stay good friends.
