'If you want to marry my brother, you should be able to see him'

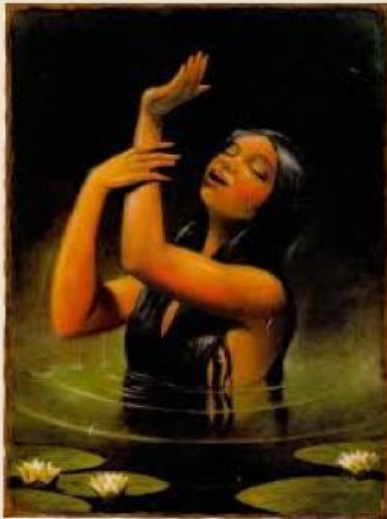
'What? Do you mean that I have a chance to see him? Tell me what I should do?' asked one of the women.
