PASSAGE 1

PENCILS

We use wooden pencils almost everyday. Pencils are manufactured in factories where machines do most of the work.

A pencil has two major parts – the lead and the wooden covering. Combining clay and a soft rock called graphite with water makes the lead. A machine presses the mixture through little holes and cuts the leads into thin sticks. Then the sticks are baked in a special oven to make them rigid.

Pieces of wood are cut into miniature, flat boards. A machine cuts three grooves into each board. One lead is put into each groove. A second board is glued on top of the first board. Then a machine cuts the board between the grooves to make three pencils. The pencils are shaped and painted. Sometimes a picture or the name of the company is stamped on each one.

Finally, the pencils are put into boxes and sent to stores where you can buy them for school.

September 3, 2004


