



Hogwarts – A Magical Education

The Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry is a famous school from the Harry Potter books. It is a magical school where young witches and wizards go to learn magic. In some ways, Hogwarts is similar to traditional British (1)___ schools, but there are also some big differences.

Another difference between Hogwarts and traditional British schools is the final exams that students take. At Hogwarts, students take their O.W.L.s (Ordinary Wizarding Levels) in their fifth year, which is similar to the (6)___ that British students take at around the same age. However, the O.W.L.s are magical exams, testing students on their ability to perform spells and use magic properly. For example, in the Charms exam, students are asked to make objects fly using a spell, while in the Herbology exam, they might need to take care of magical (7)___.

In their seventh and final year, students at Hogwarts take the N.E.W.T.s (Nastily Exhausting Wizarding Tests), which are even harder than the O.W.L.s. These exams are very important because the students' future (8)___ depend on how well students perform in their N.E.W.T.s. Students who pass their N.E.W.T.s with high marks can go on to work in special magical careers, such as being an Auror, who works to catch dark wizards.

Overall, while Hogwarts shares some similarities with British boarding schools, the magical (9)___ and exams make it a unique place of education. Students at Hogwarts not only learn valuable life lessons but also leave school with a deep knowledge of the magical (10)___.
