LEARNING TO LEARN: USING A DICTIONARY

What does a word mean? How do you say it? Use a dictionary! Dictionaries are great when you don't know a word.

Dictionaries help answer these questions:

- How many meanings of the word are there?
- Which meaning is the one you want?
- Is the word a noun, a verb, or something else?
- How do you pronounce the word?

Some dictionaries also show how to use the word in a sentence.

present¹ (noun) /preznt/ a gift

e.g., *A book is a nice present.*

present² (verb) /pri'zent/ to show something

e.g., *I presented my results to the group.*
