



## “Will” for immediate decisions and offers

We can use “will (‘ll) + base verb” to talk about spontaneous (immediate) decisions and offers

- It's so hot here. I 'll switch on the AC.
- I have been painting my room for two hours. I'll take a break.
- This blue t-shirt looks good on me. I think I'll buy it.
- Look at that lady over there. I'll help her cross the street.
- Come on, I'll help you with those bags.
- Will I fill in this form for you?
