Time travel: Is it possible?

Many of us would love to see a lost loved one again, or prevent a war, or just see what life in the future will be like. Can we change the past or the future? Scientists don't agree on an answer.

Carl Sagan said there wasn't enough evidence to decide whether time travel was possible. If time travel were possible, Sagan wondered, would we be able to interfere with things that led to our existence?

Einstein's work states that theoretically space and time can "curve back on itself," meaning that you could meet yourself as a child or witness a historical event. Some physicists say that if backward time travel were possible, you could "look around" but not interfere. They contend that the laws of physics would prevent you from changing history.

Most scientists believe time travel is impossible. They discredit theories that holes in space and time called "wormholes" exist and that humans could travel through them. They say the amount of energy required to go fast enough to travel through time would be the equivalent of the energy of a star – an amount of energy that humans could never produce.
