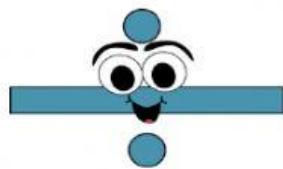

Properties of Division

When a number is divided by 1, the quotient is always that number.

For example: $27 \div 1 = 27$

When a number is divided by itself, the quotient is always 1.

For example: $9 \div 9 = 1$

When 0 is divided by a number, the quotient is always 0.

For example: $0 \div 15 = 0$
