注释 Notes

① Zǎoshang hǎo!

Good morning!

This is a greeting used at 8 or 9 a.m. or even earlier. You may say “zǎo 早” (good morning). You may respond in the same way, or you could say “nǐ zǎo 你早” (good morning to you) or “nǐ hǎo 你好” (hello).

② Zhè shì Mǎ Dàwéi.

This is Ma Dawei.

When introducing a person, “Zhè shì 这是……” (This is...) is often used. The pronunciation of “是” is weak.

③ Tā shì wǒ péngyou, gāng dào Běijīng.

He is my friend and just arrived in Beijing.

Examples similar to “wǒ péngyou 我朋友” (my friend) are “wǒ bàba 我爸爸” (my dad) and “nǐ māma 你妈妈” (your mom).

In “gāng dào Běijīng 刚到北京” (just arrived in Beijing), the subject “tā 他” is omitted. In spoken Chinese, when the subject has already appeared or the topic is understood, it is often omitted.

④ Nín hǎo!

Hello!

The respectful form of “nǐ 你” is “nín 您”. This polite expression is commonly used to address the elderly or a person of older generation. It may also be used among those of the same generation out of courtesy. People in Beijing are quite fond of using this form of address.

⑤ Nín guìxìng?

Wǒ xìng Chén.

May I have your (honorable) surname?

My surname is Chen.

This is a polite way to ask someone's surname. Note that in response, you cannot use “*Wǒ guìxìng 我贵姓……”, but should say “Wǒ xìng 我姓……” (you may add “Wǒ jiào 我叫……”). The word “guì 贵” can only be used along with “nǐ 你” (you, *singular*) or “nín 您” (you, *singular, polite*), but cannot be used with “wǒ 我” (I) or “tā 他/她” (he/she).

⑥ Nǐ shì nǎ guó rén?

Which country do you come from?

⑦ Wǒ shì Měiguórén.

I am American.

The word “rén 人” after the name of a country indicates one's nationality, e.g.,

Měiguó 美国 (America) — Měiguórén 美国人 (American)

The word “rén 人” after a place name indicates one's ancestral place or birthplace, e.g.,

Běijīng 北京 (Beijing) — Běijīngrén 北京人 (someone from Beijing)

⑧ Chén lǎoshī

Teacher Chen

In China, in addition to common relationships between people, one's position – such as a CEO, manager, section chief, engineer, director, teacher, and so on – is often used as a title. The surname is always placed before the title. The most common form of address for a teacher is “surname + lǎoshī 老师 (teacher)”, such as “Chén lǎoshī 陈老师” (Teacher Chen) and “Wáng lǎoshī 王老师” (Teacher Wang). In China, it is very impolite for a student to address a teacher by his or her name without adding the word “老师”.

注释 Notes

① Tā xǐhuan chī diǎnxin hé mǐfàn.

He likes to eat snacks and rice.

The third person “tā” in Chinese has two characters: one is the male “他” (he; him) and the other is the female “她” (she; her).

② Bāozi dà, jiǎozi xiǎo.

Steamed stuffed buns are bigger and dumplings are smaller.

In a sentence with an adjectival predicate, when “hěn 很” is not present before the adjective, it often implies a comparison. In this sentence, the sizes of “bāozi 包子” and “jiǎozi 饺子” are compared.

③ Hǎo, wǒ yào jiǎozi, yě yào bāozi.

OK, I would like *jiǎozi* (dumplings) and (would) also (like) *baozi* (steamed stuffed buns).

Here, “hǎo 好” has the meaning of OK. It is often used to express agreement, acceptance as well as the completion of the discussion on a topic.

The word “yào 要” indicates one’s desire. When shopping or ordering in a restaurant, you may say “Wǒ yào 我要……” (I want...; I would like...). A shop assistant or restaurant server often asks customers “Nín yào shénme? 您要什么?” (What would you like?)

2 语法 Grammar

1. “是” 字句 (1) A sentence with “shì 是” (to be) (1)

In a sentence with “是”, the verb “是” is used to link two related parts, which can be nouns, pronouns or noun phrases. The negative is formed by adding “bù 不” (not; changed to the 2nd tone bú) before “是”. If not particularly emphasized, “是” is usually lightly pronounced.

The negative adverb “不” must be placed before “是”.

In Chinese, the word order of an interrogative sentence using a question pronoun is the same as the word order of a declarative sentence.

3. 连词 “和” The conjunction “hé 和” (and)

The conjunction “和” usually connects pronouns, nouns, or noun phrases, such as “tā hé tā 她和他” (she and he), “bàba hé māma 爸爸和妈妈” (dad and mom), and “wǒ māma hé nǐ māma 我和妈妈” (my mom and your mom). The conjunction “和” cannot connect two sentences and is seldom used to connect two verbs or two adjectives.

4. 副词“都”的位置 The position of the adverb “dōu 都” (all; both)

Like “yě 也” (also), the adverb “都” must be placed after the subject but before the predicate verb or adjective. For example, “Bāozi hé jiǎozi dōu hěn hǎochī. 包子和饺子都很好吃。” (Both *baozi* and *jiaozi* are very delicious). You must not say “*Dōu bāozi hé jiǎozi hěn hǎochī. 都包子和饺子很好吃。” as it is grammatically incorrect. When “都” and “也” appear in the same sentence, “也” precedes “都”, for example, “Wǒ bàba hé wǒ māma yě dōu hěn máng. 我爸爸和我妈妈也都很忙。” (My dad and mom are also very busy).
