

# Past simple vs. Present perfect

We use the Past Simple Tense when talking about actions that happened at a specific time in the past.

## POSITIVE

I **ate**.  
You **ate**.  
We **ate**.  
They **ate**.  
He **ate**.  
She **ate**.  
It **ate**.

## NEGATIVE

I **didn't eat**.  
You **didn't eat**.  
We **didn't eat**.  
They **didn't eat**.  
He **didn't eat**.  
She **didn't eat**.  
It **didn't eat**.

## QUESTION

**Did** I eat?  
**Did** you eat?  
**Did** we eat?  
**Did** they eat?  
**Did** he eat?  
**Did** she eat?  
**Did** it eat?

# Past simple vs. Present perfect

We use the Present Perfect Tense when talking about actions that happened at some point in the past and are important now.

## POSITIVE

I have eaten.  
You have eaten.  
We have eaten.  
They have eaten.  
He **has** eaten.  
She **has** eaten.  
It **has** eaten.

## NEGATIVE

I haven't eaten.  
You haven't eaten.  
We haven't eaten.  
They haven't eaten.  
He **hasn't** eaten.  
She **hasn't** eaten.  
It **hasn't** eaten.

## QUESTION

Have I eaten?  
Have you eaten?  
Have we eaten?  
Have they eaten?  
Has he eaten?  
Has she eaten?  
Has it eaten?
