

- Use indirect questions with WH Questions (when/where/what/how/why). You can use all the tenses.
- Use a phrase to introduce your indirect question:
  - o Do you know.....?
  - o Can you tell me .....?
  - o Could you tell me .....?
  - o I'd like to know.....

Direct Questions	Indirect questions
<b>Simple Present</b>	
1. Where <b>do</b> you live?	Can you tell me where you live?
2. Where does your sister live?	I'd like to know where your sister lives.
<b>Simple past</b>	
3. When did you arrive?	I'd like to know when you arrived.
4. What did your parents prepare for lunch?	Can you tell me what your parents prepared for lunch?
<b>Future</b>	
5. What will your sister do next summer?	Do you know what your sister will do next summer?
6. When is she going to Japan?	Do you know when she is going to Japan?
<b>Present Perfect</b>	
7. Where has John gone?	Could you tell me where John has gone?
8. Where have you been?	I'd like to know where you have been.

2. When does the pharmacy open?

"Are you angry at me?" Jim asked.

=> Jim asked me if I was angry at him.



**11. "Is the milk fresh?"**

She asked me if the milk **was / were** fresh.

**12. "Are you a doctor?"**

She asked me if I **was / were** a doctor.

**13. "Does Julie drink tea?"**

She asked me whether Julie **drink / drank** tea.

**14. "Do you like chocolate?"**

She asked me whether I **like / liked** chocolate.

**15. "Do you love me?"**

He asked me if I **love / loved** him.

'ask me + to + infinitive':

Please help me.

She asked me to help her.



Don't smoke.

He told us not to smoke.
