Giraffe:

Eagles:

belong to the bird's family and are expert flyers. There are over 70 different kinds of eagles. Eagles mainly live in Eurasia and Africa. Their diet depends on the type, but many eagles eat fish and small animals.

Monkeys

are mammals. Some live in Africa, Asia, and South America. They eat fruits, insects, and small reptiles. The Pygmy is the smallest monkey while the Mandrill is the largest.
