1. **Spiteful (adj.):** showing malicious will and desire to hurt

The neighbor's spiteful comments ruined the neighborhood party for everyone

2. **Sneer (verb):** Express through a scornful smile

My friend let out a sneer when the boy he didn't like fell on the floor.

3. **Jeer (verb):** laugh at with contempt and derision

The team fans started to jeer at the other team when they entered the field

4. **Grope (verb):** feel about something uncertainly or blindly

In the morning, I need to grope for my glasses

5. **Sulk (verb):** be in a huff and display one's displeasure

My big brother sulks every time my mother asks him to help with something

6. **Gilded (adj.):** made from or covered with gold

I visited a museum with gilded statues on every corner

7. **Harness (noun):** an arrangement of leather straps fitted to a draft animal

The farmer needs to buy a new harness for his horse since the old one was torn

8. **Stern (adj.):** serious and harsh in manner or behavior

The teacher is stern when it comes to cheating on the exam

9. Dominion: something under control of.../ a region marked off for administrative or other purposes

These lands are under the dominion of the Scottish King

10. Courtier: an attendant for a monarch/ a person who attends a Royal Court.

The courtier bowed down as he presented the letter to the king

11. Plead: appeal or request earnestly
