

Future (**Will**): Positive & Negative

- ★ We use the **future tense** to talk about actions or events in the future.
- ★ We use **will** in the future tense. It comes **before the base verb**.
- ★ We use the future tense with these words: *tomorrow, next week, this afternoon, etc.*

Positive			Negative		
Subject	Will	Base Verb	Subject	Will + Not	Base Verb

He/She/It	will (= 'll)	go.	He/She/It	will not (= won't)	go.
We/You/They			We/You/They


