- ★ We add **-er** or **more** to adjectives to make comparatives.
- ★ We also put **than** after comparatives.

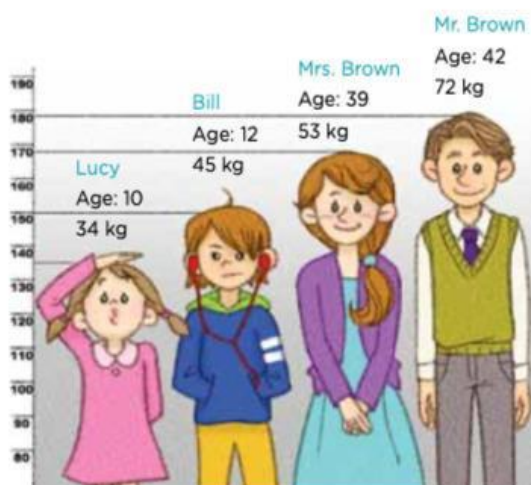
