

Wet Hairstyling

Match the following essential terms with their identifying definition.

<u> </u> skip waves	1. pin curls sliced from a shaping and formed without lifting the hair from the head.
<u> </u> no-stem curl	2. Two rows of ridge curls, usually on the side of the head.
<u> </u> shaping	3. Recommended along the front hairline to avoid breaks or splits in the finished style.
<u> </u> ridge curls	4. Pin curl placed directly on the base of the curl that produces a tight, firm, long-lasting curl.
<u> </u> spiral curls	5. Used for even construction suitable for curly hairstyles without volume or lift
<u> </u> carved curls	6. Also known as the half-moon or C-shape base.
<u> </u> closed center	7. Recommended at the hairline for a smooth upsweep effect.

rectangular base 8. Section of hair molded in a circular motion.

triangular base 9. Pin curls that produce waves that get smaller in size towards the end.

arc bases 10. Pin curls placed behind or below a ridge to form a wave.

square base 11. Forcing the strand through the comb while applying pressure with the thumb on the back of the comb to create tension.

ribboning 12. Method of curling hair by winding strand around the rod.
