### The Jarrow March

Jarrow is a town in north-east England. In the 1930s, many men there lost their jobs because the **factories** closed. In 1936, 200 men marched from Jarrow to London to protest about the situation. The march continued for 27 days and the men walked 291 miles (468 km).

David Blythe **took part** in the march. These are extracts from his diary.

5th October 1936

Today we left Jarrow! It was cold but it wasn't rainy. There were a lot of people on the streets and they **cheered** us.

11th October 1936

We arrived in the town of Ripon two days ago. We were tired and slept well – we had nice beds with pillows and blankets! Yesterday we didn't walk. We **rested**. For lunch we had a bowl of soup and a plate of meat and potatoes. Delicious!

1st November 1936

Yesterday we **reached** London! Today we had a meeting in a park. 50,000 people came! We felt very **proud**!
