Phrasal Verb	Definition
walk away from one/thing	to avoid doing something that you do not want to do, or to escape responsibility for something
do away with	to recover from
walk out of	do something good/nice to compensate after a mistake or argument
pull out of sth	busy with things that are considered to be wrong for others
stand up to one	to leave a difficult situation or relationship, etc. instead of staying and trying to deal with it
get up to sth	stop being involved in sth
make off with	remove or put an end to something
cut down on	to leave an event such as a meeting or performance because you are angry or disapprove of something
carry on with	continue an activity or task
get out of	to steal
make up for	to reduce
get over	to defend yourself against a powerful person or organization when they treat you unfairly
