### 1. THE FUTURE: BE GOING TO

- Used to talk about **intentions and plans**
- Used to talk about **evidence**

Example: I'm **going to** visit the Statue of Liberty

(+) We ..... see them  
 (-) She ..... write  
 (?) ..... you tell me?

### 2. THE FUTURE: WILL

- Used to talk about what we **think** that will happen (I think, I believe, probably, possibly, perhaps,...)
- Used to express **spontaneous reactions**
- Used for **promises**
- Used in **conditional sentences**

Example: I'll probably take two bags

(+) Perhaps we ..... see them today  
 (-) I believe she ..... write  
 (?) ..... you tell me?

### 3. THE FUTURE: PRESENT SIMPLE

- Used to talk about timetables

Example: The bus **leaves** at 10

(+) The train ..... at 7 (arrive)  
 (-) The plane ..... today (set off)  
 (?) When ..... the film .....? (start)

### 4. THE FUTURE: PRESENT CONTINUOUS

- Used to talk about arrangements, dates, appointments

Example: I'm visiting the doctor next Monday

(+) The painter ..... at 7:00 (come)  
 (-) We ..... to the doctor today (go)  
 (?) When ..... the **electrician** .....?  
 (come)

### 5. WILL vs BE GOING TO

- I'm looking at this website because **I'll / I'm going to** buy some new skiing gear.

- I've just spoken to Anna. **We're going to / We'll** go on holiday to New York together.
- Be careful! **You'll / You're going to** drop that.
