What are the UDHR?

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) is a milestone document in the history of human rights. It was written by representatives with different legal and cultural backgrounds from all regions of the world. The Declaration was proclaimed by the United Nations General Assembly in Paris on 10 December 1948. The Universal Declaration of Human Rights contains 30 rights but, in this article, only we are going to talk about 3:





Article 2:
Freedom from discrimination

- Everyone has rights regardless of sex, race, language, religion, social standing, etc.



Article 3:
Right to life

- Everyone has the right to life and to live in freedom and safety



Article 18:
Freedom of religion or belief

- Everyone has the right to freely manifest their religion, to change it and to practice it alone or with others.
