Blind Men and the Elephant!

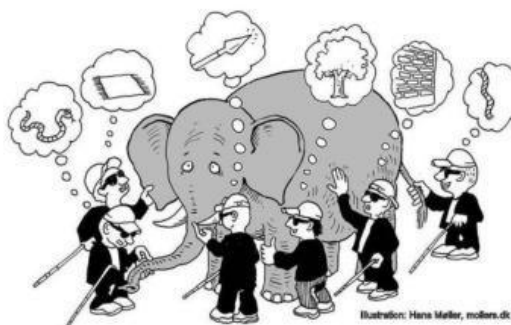
One morning, six blind men heard exciting news in their village: "An elephant is here!" People were shouting and running to see the giant animal.
