

Too vs Enough

ESL Worksheet for Adult Learners



Too is used before an adjective or adverb to intensify them. It suggests that there is more of something than is desirable, suitable, or needed. It can also be placed before a noun with "much" or "many".

Examples:

- The soup was **too** hot to eat immediately.
- The music was playing **too** loudly for me to study.
- There are **too** many people in the conference room.

Enough is used to say 'as much as necessary.' It suggests that there is an appropriate or satisfactory amount or degree of something. It is placed after adjectives, adverbs, or verbs. Enough can also be placed before nouns (plural countable or uncountable) as a determiner.

Examples:

- He ran fast **enough** to get to the bus.
- You have done **enough** work for the week. Please take a break...
- I have **enough** money to buy a brand-new car.
