Ray was already working and saving at a young age. When he was 12, he helped his uncle sell fruits at a night market once a week, at weekends and during long school holidays. His uncle paid him RM20 for a full day's work. He earned between RM5 and RM10 if he worked for several hours. Ray never spent his money on food or toys. He saved it all in the bank.

A few years later, he did garden work or **errands** for his relatives and neighbours. They paid him RM10 an hour. Even though he was making more money now, he saved eighty percent of what he earned. Saving became a habit for Ray. As a result, he had the freedom to buy large items when he was a young adult, without going into debt.

Nowadays, Ray advises his **clients** with young children to encourage their children to save at a young age.
