Remember!

We use *some, a lot of, lots of* with both countable nouns and uncountable nouns to describe quantities.

Example:

- I need **some** apples for this recipe.



- There's **some** water in the bottle.



- There are **a lot of / lots of** people in the room.



- She likes coffee with **a lot of / lots of** sugar.
