While he insisted the book wasn't meant to _____ **even with** Madonna, she didn't agree and tensions between them grew.

Madonna's performance of *Like a Virgin* at the 1984 MTV Video Music Awards caused quite a stir. She claimed she was on stage rolling around to _____ **rid of** a lost shoe. However, many believe the story
