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It is a common misconception that greenhouse gases only have detrimental effects on the Earth and our world would be a much better place without them. In actual fact, they play an indispensable role in our ecology. The Earth's most abundant greenhouse gases include carbon dioxide, methane, ozone, CFCs and water vapour, all of which can be found near the Earth surface.
