

Paragraphs

paragraph = three or more sentences about 1 idea

sentence = one complete idea

Every paragraph has 2 parts. The **first** part is the **topic sentence**. The topic sentence tells the topic of the paragraph, i.e. what the paragraph talks about.

The rest of the paragraph, the **second** part, tells supporting **details**. Details can be more information, reasons, or examples. They tell more about the topic.

Bad topic sentence: My dog is brown. What else can you say about the color brown? Not much! Reasons he's brown? No. Information about the color brown? No. Examples of the color brown? No.

Good topic sentence: My dog is my best friend. What can you say about the dog being your best friend? A lot! You can give **reasons** he is your best friend. You can give **examples** of how he acts like a friend. You can give **information** about the type of dog he is.
