

Look at how we use 'although / though / even though' to join the sentences.

**Example:**      He tried to persuade me to watch a film. I did not go with him.  
                      = Although he tried to persuade me to watch a film, I did not go with him.  
                      = I did not go with him although he tried to persuade me to watch a film.

Notes: 'Although / though / even though' **thing that happened first**, **thing that happened later**.  
**Thing that happened later** 'although / though / even though' **thing that happened first**.
